The Entrance

This is the entrance to Royston Cave. It is in the side of a building.

At the entrance you will be greeted by a friendly tour guide. This is where you buy tickets. You may need to queue if it is busy. The tour guide will give you a leaflet about Royston Cave. You can ask them any questions you have.

If a tour guide is not there it means they are busy with another tour. You will need to wait patiently outside until they are finished.





The Steps

When it is time for your tour, the tour guide will take you inside. You will walk down 17 steps into a chalk tunnel. Mind your head.





The Tunnel

The tunnel is underground so it can be damp and slippery. The floor is uneven so walk carefully. There are handrails on both sides to hold onto and the tunnel has good lighting.

At the bottom of the tunnel there are another 5 steps.





Royston Cave

You are now in Royston Cave.

It is quite dark and damp in Royston Cave, and it might smell like wet earth. There is low lighting so you can see the carvings.

The carvings are very delicate so you must not touch them. Make sure to stay behind the railings.





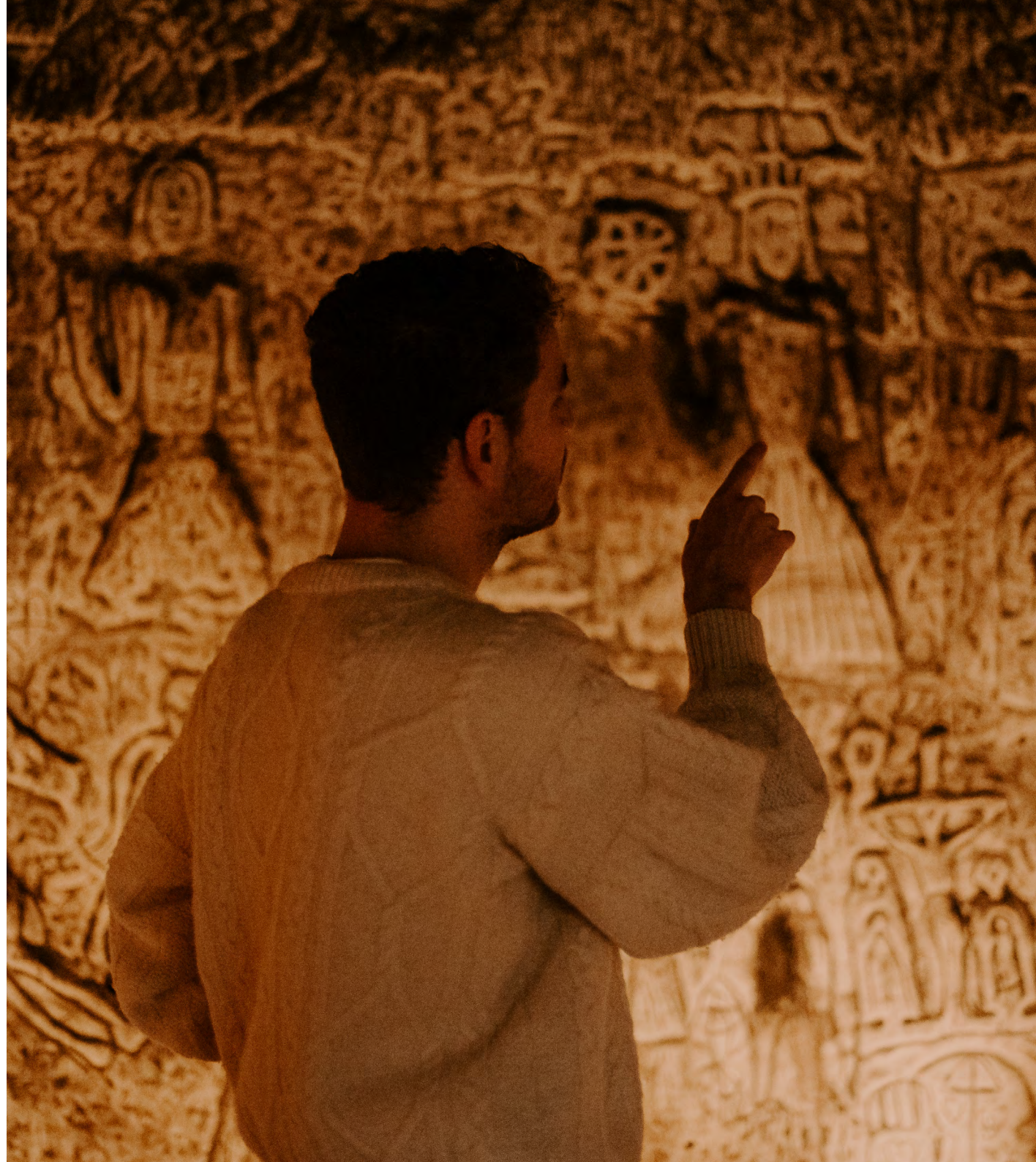
The Tour

There is lots to see in Royston Cave. The carvings have different meanings. Listen to the tour guide as they explain what each one means.

Voices echo in the cave and you might be able to hear cars on the road above.

Sometimes the guide might play an audio tape. The audio tape is loud and echoey.

Follow the tour guide's torch as they show you around.





The End

The tour lasts about 30 minutes. There will be time afterwards to ask the tour guide questions.

When you are ready to leave, you exit the same way you entered. It is quite steep going back up the tunnel.
